Our Project Information Office is now open from Iocal Jeannine) should you have any questions and 9:30am to 4pm Monday to Friday.

For over 20 years, the Waihi mine has had a publicly accessible space for anyone to stop by and find out more about our operations. Today, our Project Information Office at 86 Seddon Street continues this engagement.

Stop in for any general enquiries, including information on current and planned projects, property due diligence, job opportunities, the Amenity Effects Programme, or sponsorships and donations.

Brochures relating to our proposed Martha Open Pit and proposed Waihi North Projects are available. The office is staffed (usually by knowledgeable there are large format maps of both the town and our operational areas available to view.

We encourage anyone new to Waihi with an interest in mining or completing their due diligence on a potential land or property purchase in the area to come and chat to us as well.



Community Opinions About Mining

A reminder that from now through until the end of the year, if you live in the Waihi area you may get a phone call on your land-line or mobile phone from a survey company called Phoenix Research, asking for your opinion on a few topics relating to mining.

Each year we get an independent survey company to ask people chosen at random how they think we are doing, what we can improve on, and how things are in Waihi in general. The surveyors aim to get a representative sampling of the area, in a similar proportion to the actual demographic make-up of Waihi. This approach is to ensure the fairest possible representation of the area's opinions.

Results from the survey form part of the Social Impact Management Plan (SIMP), which is required as part of our consent conditions.

The survey is anonymous. OceanaGold gets a table of the results, but any identifying details are first removed, meaning we don't know who said what. How do survey companies get in touch? They call people in and around Waihi from listings with the numbers and the area in which the person lives.

We welcome your feedback and encourage you to participate if selected. A survey like this is an important chance for you to "have your say".
